Children turning four years old in 2014 who live in New York City are eligible for **FREE pre-k** at high-quality Community-Based Early Childhood Centers.

What is a Community-Based Early Childhood Center (CBECC)?

Community-Based Early Childhood Centers, or CBECCs, include many daycare centers, private schools, preschools, libraries, and museums. CBECCs are located across the City, and have been screened and approved by the Department of Education's Division of Early Childhood for safety, security, and quality.

Applying to a CBECC Pre-k Program

CBECCs manage their own application processes. To apply for pre-k at a CBECC, contact the program directly. A list of CBECCs is available at nyc.gov/prek. Additional programs will be added to this list in June.
